Establishing a Classroom Climate

With colleagues...

- * Brainstorm with colleagues (PLC, GRADE-level) for consistency
- * Ask questions!
- * Restrictions? Consequences? Where/when are iPads allowed?

In your class...

- * Brainstorm with students. (Being good digital citizens) - look up digital citizenship online - great stuff on Pinterest
- * Teach expectations over time (just like any other expectation)
- * iPad ok/ not ok time (stoplight; face down; out of sight)
- * Notifications
- * Directly address social media & game use - boundaries, consequences





TECHNOLOGY

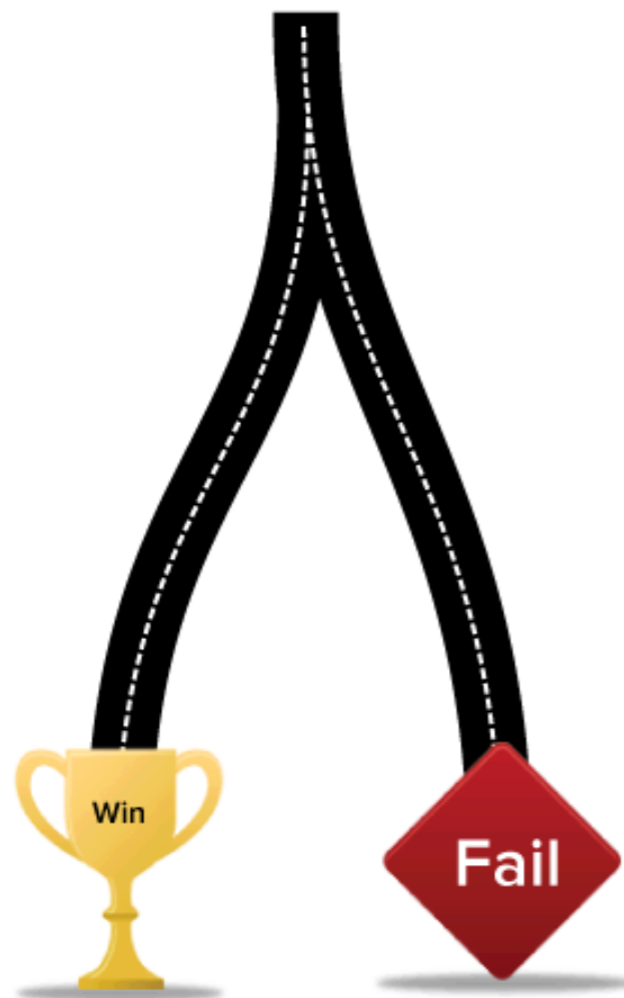
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Communicate with parents!

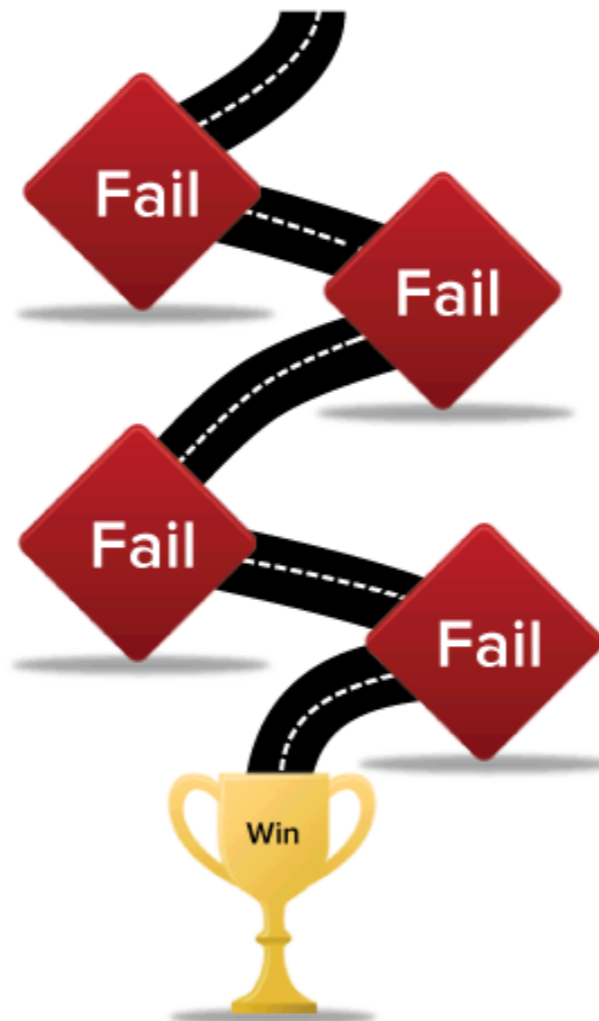
Start a list of your classroom expectations, communication home, syllabus expectations, conversations to have with adults in your building, and what to discuss & establish with students.
