## LIST \#1

Code switch: Changing yourself to fit a situation appropriately (words, mannerisms, clothing)
Diligent: working hard; constant effort to accomplish something
Engage: focus your whole attention (mind and body) on something
Proactive: to prepare ahead of time for a situation that is coming up
Tenacious: persistent; refusing to give up; holding tight; not letting go

Annotate: to make notes or comments on
Compare: To notice or describe the similarities
Contrast: To notice or describe the differences
Vague: Not clearly stated or addressed
Elaborate: To add details to; to expand

Analyze: To closely examine the parts of something
Synthesize: To put the parts together to form something new or bigger (like a new understanding)
Evaluate: To judge the value or worth of something
Sequence: To put in order
Infer: To come to a conclusion by reasoning

Accurate: Exact; correct in the details
Inquiry: Asking for information
Persistent:Continuing on despite difficulties
Grapple: To try to solve a problem; to overcome
Ponder: To think about; consider carefully

Clarify: To make clear; free from confusion
Figurative: Symbolic; Involving a figure of speech
Literal: True to fact; actual
Preview: To view or show beforehand
Transition: A change from one subject or concept to another
