<u>Code switch</u>: Changing yourself to fit a situation appropriately (words, mannerisms, clothing) <u>Diligent</u>: working hard; constant effort to accomplish something <u>Engage</u>: focus your whole attention (mind and body) on something <u>Proactive</u>: to prepare ahead of time for a situation that is coming up <u>Tenacious</u>: persistent; refusing to give up; holding tight; not letting go
